DESCRIPTION

Pollock armchair designed by Charles Pollock in the early 1960s and produced by Knoll in the United States.

The armchair features a polished cast aluminum base with a four-star configuration, a technical and aesthetic signature of the model. The generously padded seat and backrest are upholstered in black leather, creating an elegant contrast with the reflective aluminum structure. The design combines geometric clarity with controlled comfort, reflecting Charles Pollock's modernist approach, balancing functionality, restraint and industrial quality. The well-proportioned

silhouette and visual continuity between structure and upholstery give the armchair a strong presence, suitable for both domestic interiors and office or reception settings.

The Pollock armchair stands as an iconic example of postwar American design, emblematic of executive seating and of the long-standing collaboration between Charles Pollock and Knoll around timeless and durable furniture.
